OSHA sets standards or laws that business have to follow



If a business does not follow these standards they will be given citations and fines for non-compliance



OSHA standards are not always clear and easy to understand or implement. Often times standards are left open for interpretation



Thus we use a tool called Hierarchy of Controls to guide our safety program

Hierarchy of Controls

How it works...

- ❑ OSHA will evaluate a business's level of compliance with standards based on the hierarchy of controls
- ❑ OSHA wants businesses to aim for the highest possible level of control/protection
- ❑ Every situation is unique and the best most feasible solution must be determined based on this hierarchy
